Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. You have six days each week for your ordinary work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath day of rest **dedicated to the Lord your God**. On that day no one in your household may do any work. This includes you, your **sons and daughters, your male and female servants, your livestock, and any foreigners living among you**. For in six days the Lord made the heavens, the earth, the sea, and everything in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the Lord **blessed** the Sabbath day and set it apart as holy. **Exodus 20:8-11**



Remember

The Sabbath commandment is the only one that begins with the word “remember.”
What are we being **reminded**?

On the seventh day God had finished his work of creation, so he rested from all his work. And **God blessed the seventh day and declared it holy**, because it was the day when he rested from all his work of creation. **Genesis 2:2-3**



Remember

The Hebrew word translated “remember” in our English Bibles is **zakar**. Essentially, it means to call to remembrance, to record or to mark. When God gave the Fourth Commandment, He basically said, Don’t forget this, mark this, specifically remember to remember this! **Erik Jones**

“But watch out! Be careful never to forget what you yourself have seen. Do not let these **memories escape from your mind as long as you live!** And be sure to pass them on to your children and grandchildren. Sabbath For Everyone

The Sabbath is one of Judaism's greatest **gifts to humanity**. People in the ancient Near East had nothing similar to the Jewish concept of a weekly sacred day of rest. Other cultures in the past knew of a seven-day week based on the phases of the moon, but the Israelite Sabbath is not connected to the movements of celestial bodies. **It stands apart.**

Sabbath For Everyone

According to this passage of Scripture, the purpose of the Sabbath is to give rest to those who must do work all other days of the week: oxen and asses, slaves and strangers. In the ancient world being a slave meant absolute subservience and unending work for one's master; **the Sabbath extricated the slave once a week from subservience to his master.** Thus the Sabbath essentially curbed and restricted the institution of slavery, from which we can understand its association with the exodus from Egypt. **Doron Danino**

Slaves were used for economic gain, to rest them meant you lost money



Sabbath For Everyone

The Sabbath was a **radical concept** of dignity and respect for every aspect of society that wasn't because of the kindness of people but because of the graciousness of God

On that day no one in your household may do any work. This includes you, your sons and daughters, your male and female servants, your oxen and donkeys and other livestock, and any foreigners living among you. All your male and female servants must rest as you do. **Remember that you were once slaves in Egypt** Deuteronomy 5:14-15

Sabbath conferred **dignity** upon all of Creation



Set Aside

You have been **set apart** as holy to the Lord your God, and he has **chosen** you from all the nations of the earth to be his own special treasure. **Deuteronomy 14:2**

You can be sure of this: The Lord **set apart** the godly for himself. **Psalm 14:3**

But you are not like that, for you are a **chosen** people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own **possession**. **1 Peter 2:9**

The Science of Sabbath

Tech Shabbat is a modern twist on an ancient religious practice, which is attracting the attention of **burned-out** millennials and others who are **exhausted** by trying to keep up in an increasingly connected and fast-paced world.

And there's some science to support the idea that practicing a day of rest — including time away from social media and digital devices — **benefits longevity and both mental and physical health.**

Research presented last year at the annual convention of the American Psychological Association suggests that constantly staring at screens may be making us more **“distracted, distant and drained.”** Other studies of social media use have linked it to everything from loneliness to disrupted sleep.

Jesus and the Sabbath

One Sabbath day as Jesus was walking through some grainfields, his disciples began breaking off heads of grain to eat. But the Pharisees said to Jesus, “Look, why are they **breaking the law** by harvesting grain on the Sabbath?” **Mark 2:23-24**

Then Jesus said to them, “**The Sabbath was made to meet the needs of people**, and not people to meet the requirements of the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord, even over the Sabbath!” **vs 27-28**



Jesus and the Sabbath

Then Jesus said to his critics, “I have a question for you. Does the law permit good deeds on the Sabbath, or is it a day for doing evil? **Is this a day to save life or to destroy it?**” **Matthew 12:9**

Jesus, however, pointed out the true purpose of the day intended from its inception: God created the day to be a blessing, a time for genuine rest from normal labors rather than an unmanageable, overly restrictive burden. **It was a time to be enjoyed, not endured.** Further, He said the Sabbath was created for all mankind, not just for the nation of Israel.

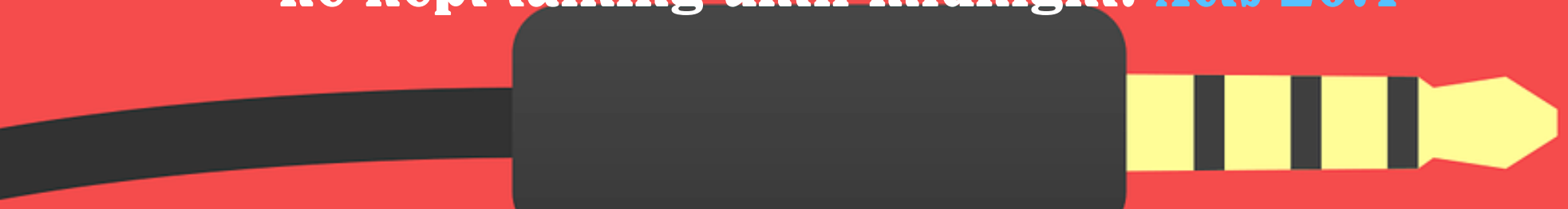
Sabbath Practices

On the Sabbath we went a little way outside the city to a riverbank, where we thought people would be meeting for prayer, and we sat down to speak with some women who had gathered there. **Acts 16:13**

As was Paul's custom, he went to the synagogues service, and for **three Sabbaths in a row** he used the Scriptures to reason with the people. **Acts 17:2**

Each Sabbath found Paul at the synagogues, trying to convince the **Jews and Greeks alike**. **Acts 18:4**

On the first day of the week, we gathered with the local believers to share in the Lord's Supper.[c] Paul was preaching to them, and since he was leaving the next day, he kept talking until midnight. **Acts 20:7**
