
Why Are Christians Uncomfortable with the Supernatural?, Dr Michael Heiser

Modern Christianity suffers from two serious shortcomings when it comes to the supernatural world.

First, many Christians claim to believe in the supernatural but think (and live) like **skeptics**. We find talk of the supernatural world **uncomfortable**. This is typical of denominations and evangelical congregations outside the charismatic movement –in other words, those from a background like my own.

The second serious shortcoming is evident within the charismatic movement: the elevation of **experience over Scripture**. While that movement is predisposed to embrace the idea of an animate spiritual world, its conception of that world is framed largely by experience and an idiosyncratic reading of the book of **Acts**.

There are two basic reasons why non-charismatics tend to close the door on the supernatural world. One is there suspicion that charismatic practices are detached from sound exegesis of Scripture. As a biblical scholar, it's easy for me to agree with that suspicion-but over time it has widely degenerated into a closed-minded overreaction that is itself detached from the worldview of the biblical writers.



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The other reason is less self-congratulatory. The believing church is bending under the weight of its own rationalism, a modern worldview that would be foreign to the biblical writers. Traditional Christian teaching has for centuries kept the unseen world at arm's length. We believe in the Godhead because there's no point to Christianity without it. The rest of the unseen world is handled with a whisper or a chuckle.

The problems/challenges in your life are natural with supernatural implications

The problems/challenges in your **spirit** are **supernatural** with natural implications

Anointing is a form of consecrating a sacred person or item, and initiating it in its special function. In the Torah it was done to the Tabernacle (Exodus 30:26-30), to High Priests (as well as all the Priests when the Tabernacle was first dedicated), and occasionally to kings. Rabbi Dovid Rosenfeld

Prophet, priest and King were the intertwining of every aspect of a person's natural and supernatural life

The Messiah and the Spirit Messiah is derived from the Hebrew word mashiach which means "anointed one" and which corresponds to the NT title of "Christ" (Christos = anointed one).

The Messiah and the Spirit

And the **Spirit** of the Lord will rest on him—the **Spirit** of wisdom and understanding, the **Spirit** of counsel and might, the **Spirit** of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. Isaiah 11:2

I have put my **Spirit** upon him. He will bring justice to the nations. Isaiah 42:1b

The **Spirit of the Sovereign Lord** is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me...lsaiah 61:1a

The story of the Exodus from Egypt makes it clear that man is unable to redeem himself; only G-d can be the redeemer... However, whereas the first redemption had a spiritual dimension to it, it did not bring about a change to the world itself. Hence, the first redemption was primarily physical in nature, while the final redemption will be vastly spiritual in nature. This later redemption of Messiah will bring about a total change to the world in which man resides... Isaiah tells that the Spirit of HaShem will rest upon Messiah. This Spirit reveals many attributes: wisdom and understanding, counsel and strength, and knowledge and fear of HaShem. By means of these attributes Messiah will bring divine justice into the world and solve the problem of evil. Dr Baruch Korman (Rabbi)

Jesus, Second Adam

Jesus **emptied** Himself in at least three different ways. First, He **voluntarily** accepted the **limitations** of being a human being. Second, His **glory was hidden** from the people. Jesus baptism was the beginning of His ministry but also the start of the miraculous




But when you are **directed** by the Spirit, you are not under obligation to the law of Moses. Galatians 5:18

Adoption and Identity: Issues to Be Aware Of, Considering Adoption

- **Identity formation** is something that happens throughout childhood and adolescence and continues to evolve and change throughout a person's life. Your identity is partly defined by where you feel like you 'fit' within your family and peers.
- For adoptees, forming a healthy self-identity can be a challenge if you don't feel like you fit in with either your birth or adoptive families. Some adoptees feel split between the two, or they feel different from peers who were raised by their biological families. This sense of alienation that some adoptees experience can create an adoption identity crisis, which can sometimes contribute to feelings of anxiety, depression, or low self-esteem.


